# June – Quiz 3

- Bulger was found living quietly in a rentcontrolled Santa Monica apartment with over \$800,000 in cash hidden in the walls — despite being one of the FBI's Most Wanted fugitives.
- Once ridiculed as a white elephant after hosting the controversial Millennium Experience, the Dome was reborn as The O2 now one of the world's busiest music venues
- Though celebrated for her role as Dorothy in The Wizard of Oz, Garland's life was marked by hardship — her overdose in London ended a career that saw both Hollywood triumph and personal tragedy.
- Her high-profile split from Tom Cruise was executed with military precision — she reportedly used disposable phones and surprise legal filings to avoid interference from Cruise's Scientology circle.
- When Apple launched the iPhone, it not only revolutionized phones — it reinvented how we take photos, browse the web, communicate, shop, and even work. It sold over 6 million units before the next model arrived.
- Holding the record for most Best Actress Oscars (4), Hepburn defied Hollywood norms with her fiercely independent spirit, famously refusing to conform to studio rules or gender expectations.
- Jackson plummeted 50 feet after a stage bridge collapsed during Earth Song in Munich — astonishingly, he completed the concert despite suffering a damaged spine and broken foot.
- Their 1967 drug arrests at Jagger's country estate became a flashpoint in the clash between counterculture and the British establishment — prompting a Times editorial titled "Who Breaks a Butterfly on a Wheel?"
- The Monroe-Miller marriage stunned the public — the glamorous star and the cerebral playwright made headlines worldwide, though their relationship crumbled amid professional pressures and FBI scrutiny of Miller.
- The original Globe burned to the ground when a theatrical cannon misfired during a performance of Henry VIII — but thanks to its wooden structure, no deaths were recorded, and it was rebuilt within a year.
- Leaving early for a TV interview sparked fury across the political spectrum — forcing Sunak to apologize amid accusations of disrespecting veterans and mishandling the moment.
- The toppling of Colston's statue during a Black Lives Matter protest became a defining image of 2020, reigniting debates about how Britain confronts its colonial and slave-trading past.
