- David Cameron became the youngest UK Prime Minister in nearly 200 years when he took office in 2010, at age 43.
- Deep Blue's victory over Garry Kasparov in 1997 marked the first time a computer beat a reigning world chess champion in a match under standard tournament rules.
- The Bradford City stadium fire spread in less than four minutes due to the highly flammable wooden stands, many of which dated back to the early 20th century.
- The title was inspired by a drawing John Lennon's son Julian made in school, featuring his friend Lucy surrounded by stars.
- Helen Sharman was selected from over 13,000 applicants and flew aboard the Soviet space station Mir, becoming the first woman to visit it.
- The eruption of Mount St. Helens in 1980 reduced the height of the mountain by over 1,300 feet and released energy equivalent to about 1,600 times the Hiroshima bomb.
- John Bellingham remains the only person to have successfully assassinated a British Prime Minister — Spencer Perceval — in 1812.
- George Floyd's murder sparked worldwide protests and led to renewed calls for racial justice and police reform under the Black Lives Matter movement.
- 9. A cultural juggernaut, Oprah's talk show aired over 4,500 episodes and launched the careers of Dr. Phil, Dr. Oz, and many others.
- The loss of HMS Coventry and Atlantic Conveyor marked one of the deadliest days for British forces during the Falklands War, underscoring the vulnerability of ships to air attack.
- Oscar Wilde's trial and conviction for homosexuality scandalized Victorian society; he famously quipped, "I have nothing to declare but my genius" on arriving in the U.S.
- 12. Madeleine McCann's disappearance remains one of the most high-profile missing persons cases in modern history, sparking investigations across Europe and beyond.
