- Stephen Hendry was just 30 years old when he won his seventh title, a record that stood unmatched until Ronnie O'Sullivan equalled it in 2022.
- 2. Although known for their 1985 hit Walking on Sunshine, Love Shine a Light became their biggest UK chart hit, reaching number 3.
- The system crashed just after typing the first two letters of the word "LOGIN," making "LO" the accidental first message in internet history.
- 4. The operation, performed at the National Heart Hospital in London, came just five months after the world's first heart transplant in South Africa.
- Henry Cooper is the only boxer to have knocked down Muhammad Ali (then Cassius Clay) in a professional bout — with his famous left hook, "Enry's 'Ammer."
- The original iPod could store 1,000 songs and revolutionized music consumption; it paved the way for iTunes and, eventually, the iPhone.
- 7. Conchita's victory became a global symbol for LGBTQ+ rights, earning praise from international celebrities and politicians.
- The tragedy was chronicled in Jon Krakauer's bestselling book Into Thin Air, which became a gripping account of human endurance and hubris.
- Mandela was imprisoned for 27 years, and upon his release, he helped unite a deeply divided nation, winning the Nobel Peace Prize in 1993.
- Though Betamax offered better picture quality than VHS, it lost the format war largely due to shorter recording times and licensing decisions.
- Hess secretly flew solo from Germany to Scotland and parachuted into a field near Glasgow, hoping to broker peace — but was immediately arrested.
- 12. Hoover served under eight U.S. presidents and turned the FBI into a powerful force though his secretive methods and personal files sparked controversy after his death.
