1. Cardiff Airport, despite its name, is located about 12 miles southwest of Cardiff city centre, in the rural Vale of Glamorgan.

DID YOU KNOW?

- This inland county is the largest in Wales by area and was formed from Montgomeryshire, Radnorshire, and Brecknockshire.
- Shirley Bassey hit No. 1 in the UK with "As I Love You," making her the first Welsh artist to top the chart.
- 4. Wogan Cavern lies directly underneath the castle and was once used as a prehistoric shelter and later a wine cellar!
- Located in Llantrisant, this facility produces all the UK's coins and many for countries worldwide.
- "Aber" means "mouth of the river" or "confluence," seen in names like Aberystwyth and Abergavenny.
- This lightweight, bowl-shaped boat dates back centuries and was once used for fishing on Welsh rivers.
- Also called Bala Lake, it's the largest natural lake in Wales and home to the rare Gwyniad fish.
- Llandrindod Wells and Builth Wells are spa towns, famous for their mineral springs in the 19th century.
- 10. These festivals are key to Welsh culture, with competitions in poetry, music, and performance.
- Ceredigion was historically known as Cardiganshire before the modern Welsh name was officially adopted.
- Castell Dinas Brân overlooks the town of Llangollen and offers panoramic views of the Dee Valley.
