- Destiny's Child started with four number but found their biggest success as a trio. They've sold over 60 million records worldwide!
- Also known as "Posh Spice", Victoria focused on her fashion empire while the rest of the group reunited for the sold-out
- Acker Bilk's signature look included a bowler hat and striped waistcoat, making him one of the most recognizable figures in traditional jazz.
- Buddy Holly's influence on rock music was so profound that The Beatles cited him as a major inspiration.
- 5. The Proms have been held since 1895 and the Royal Albert Hall has hosted the Last Night every year since 1941!
- 6. Skiffle influenced many famous British rock musicians, including a young John Lennon, who formed his first band as a skiffle group.
- 7. Known for her powerful voice and anticonsumerist lyrics, Poly Styrene became a punk icon at just 19 years old.
- This phrase has become a mantra for aspiring songwriters, emphasizing simplicity and emotional honesty.
- Though it's her only hit, "Mickey" became a pop culture classic and has been covered and parodied countless times.
- 10. In 2017, Lorde admitted to running a secret account reviewing onion rings from around the world. The account was deleted after fans discovered it.
- Sam Fender won the BRITs Critics' Choice Award in 2019, and "Seventeen Going Under" cemented his place as one of the UK's top young artists.
- 12. After Collins left, Genesis tried to continue with new singers, but the band eventually went on hiatus. They later reunited for a farewell tour in the 2020s.

- Beryl the Peril, first appearing in The Topper in 1953, transferred to The Dandy in 1993 and became one of the comic's bestknown troublemakers.
- Cyprus was one of the lavish gifts given by Mark Antony to Cleopatra, which outraged Rome and contributed to the fall of the Roman Republic.
- 7. Walmart acquired ASDA in 1999 to expand into the UK market. It sold the chain in 2021.
- The Statue of Liberty is covered in copper sheets that have oxidized to a green patina—a natural protective layer.

- Halley's Comet was the first comet predicted to return based on orbital calculations—returning approximately every 76 years.
- Rorschach inkblots are ambiguous and symmetrical, used in psychological assessments to reveal personality traits.
- Smog is a combination of smoke and fog, usually caused by pollution in densely populated or industrial areas.
- Charon is Pluto's largest moon and is so big compared to Pluto that they're often referred to as a double dwarf planet system.
- Physiotherapy uses exercises, massage, and other techniques to treat pain, injury, or disability.

- Green Shield Stamps were loyalty camp collected from shops, redeemable for household goods like toasters during the 1960s.
- The Mods and Rockers were rival youth subcultures known for their clashes on British beaches in the 1960s, especially in Brighton.
- The Numbers Game invented by Howard Garns was later renamed Sudoku, becoming a global sensation in the 2000s.
- In a memorable 1974 streaking incident at Twickenham, a policeman shielded the streaker's modesty by using his helmet to cover the private parts.
- Ryanair started flights in the 1980s from Waterford to London and grew to become one of Europe's largest budget airlines.
- Inky, Blinky, and Pinky are the ghost enemies in Pac-Man, one of the most famous arcade games of the 1980s.
- Britney Spears' 1999 Rolling Stone cover famously featured her in underwear holding a purple Teletubby doll, blending childhood imagery with a mature pop star image.
- NASA's Pathfinder mission successfully explored Mars, sending back critical images and data.
- On MySpace, every user was automatically friends with Tom, the platform's cofounder.
- 10. The Juicy Couture velour tracksuit was a fashion icon in the 2000s, popularized by celebrities.
