- Prince Philip completed more than 22,000 solo engagements before his retirement—making him one of the most active royals in history!
- Sir Chris Hoy's gold in 2012 made him the most decorated British Olympian at the time, and he later went on to win six Olympic golds in total!
- The Sixth Sense was nominated for six Academy Awards and is best remembered for the chilling line: "I see dead people."
- The Summerland fire remains one of the worst peacetime fire disasters in British history. It led to significant changes in fire safety regulations across the UK.
- Although Einstein signed the letter, it was physicist Leo Szilard who drafted it. This letter ultimately led to the formation of the Manhattan Project, which developed the first nuclear bombs.
- Although officially ruled an accident, many now believe William Rufus may have been assassinated, possibly as part of a plot to place his brother, Henry I, on the throne.
- Charles Kennedy was only 39 years old when he became leader, making him the youngest leader of a major British political party at the time.
- This concert marked Freddie Mercury's last live performance with Queen, making it an emotional and iconic farewell for fans.
- Daley Thompson remains one of only two decathletes to win back-to-back Olympic gold medals, a feat considered one of the toughest in athletics.
- Brighton's liberal reputation was further cemented with the opening of Black Rock Beach, now a well-known symbol of body positivity and freedom.
- The bombing of Nagasaki occurred just three days after Hiroshima and led to Japan's surrender, effectively ending World War II.
- Edward VII was already 59 when he became king, having waited longer than any British heir in history at that time.
