- The iconic song "Don't Cry for Me Argentina" from Evita became a charttopping hit even before the show officially opened on stage.
- The original Ferris wheel stood 264 feet tall and could carry over 2,000 people at a time — it was America's answer to the Eiffel Tower!
- Charles Lucas was only 20 years old when he earned the very first Victoria Cross, which remains the highest award for gallantry in the British armed forces.
- 4. Ghislaine Maxwell, a British socialite, was found guilty of recruiting and grooming young girls for Jeffrey Epstein. Her trial revealed disturbing details about their decades-long abuse network.
- After their departure from Top Gear, the trio went on to launch The Grand Tour on Amazon Prime, bringing their signature banter and car reviews to a global streaming audience.
- The Gateshead Millennium Bridge is nicknamed the "Winking Eye Bridge" due to its unique tilting mechanism, which resembles a blinking eye when it opens for boats.
- 7. The infamous incident is often called "The Bite Fight" and led to Tyson losing his boxing license temporarily and being fined \$3 million.
- After being the UK's first female Prime Minister and serving for over 11 years, Margaret Thatcher became a member of the House of Lords as Baroness Thatcher following her retirement.
- The Treaty of Versailles is widely considered a contributing factor to World War II due to the economic and political instability it caused in Germany.
- Gavrilo Princip, a 19-year-old Bosnian Serb nationalist, carried out the assassination.
 His actions set off a chain of alliances that escalated into a global war.
- 11. The saxophone bridges the gap between woodwind and brass instruments. Though invented for classical and military bands, it's now iconic in jazz music.
- Henry VIII is best known for his six marriages and for breaking England away from the Roman Catholic Church to form the Church of England.
