2. What is the primary flavour of the liqueur Cointreau?	2. Orange	2. Cointreau is a type of triple sec and adds a citrusy punch to many cocktails.
3. What alcoholic spirit is the base of a classic daiquiri?	3. Rum	3. Ernest Hemingway loved daiquiris—his version skipped the sugar!
4. What type of fortified wine is produced in Spain’s Jerez region?	4. Sherry	4. “Sherry” is derived from “Jerez,” the wine’s Spanish birthplace.
