2. Temple, King, and Murcott are all varieties of which citrus fruit?	2. Orange	2. Oranges have numerous varieties, and Temple and Murcott are especially popular in the U.S. for juicing and snacking.
3. The Vale of Evesham is especially famous for producing which type of crop?	3. Asparagus	3. The Vale of Evesham in Worcestershire is one of the UK's most fertile growing areas, particularly renowned for its asparagus festivals.
4. Morello is a variety of which fruit, often used in cooking and baking?	4. Cherry	4. Morello cherries are sour and dark-skinned—ideal for pies, jams, and even liqueurs.
5. Which fruit contains more vitamin C on average: an orange or a kiwi?	5. Kiwi	5. A kiwi typically contains nearly twice the vitamin C of an orange, despite its smaller size.
