# Did You Know?

- X The Wagner Group has operated in conflicts across the globe and faces widespread accusations of serious human rights abuses.
- The term "Stockholm Syndrome" was coined after a 1973 bank robbery in Sweden, where freed hostages shockingly defended their captors — a case that fascinated psychologists worldwide.
- 3. Cynthia and John Lennon met while studying at art school and married during the height of early Beatlemania.
- 4. A William Wallace's enormous sword is still proudly displayed at the National Wallace Monument, symbolizing Scotland's fight for freedom.
- Kidnapped at just ten years old, she escaped eight years later and went on to write a bestselling memoir recounting her incredible survival.
- 6. The theft of the Mona Lisa in 1911 made the painting a global sensation; it was found two years later in Italy when the thief tried to sell it.
- Glamis Castle, steeped in history, also appears in Shakespeare's Macbeth as the setting of some of the play's darkest scenes.
- 8. A secret protocol of the Molotov– Ribbentrop Pact divided Eastern Europe between Germany and the Soviet Union, paving the way for World War II.
- Mawaii is the only U.S. state made up entirely of islands — and it even has its own distinct time zone.
- 11. Though revolutionary as the world's first nuclear-powered merchant ship, the NS Savannah was never commercially viable and was soon retired.
- 12. She made history by joining the East Sussex Fire Brigade, helping open doors for women across the UK's fire services.
