Did You Know?



-  Anthony Hopkins initially declined to return as Hannibal Lecter but changed his mind after reading the screenplay.
-  Jodie Foster declined to reprise her role as Clarice Starling due to disagreements with the novel's portrayal of her character.
-  Julianne Moore replaced Jodie Foster as Clarice Starling and researched the role by training with the FBI.
-  The infamous dinner scene where Lecter feeds Krendler part of his own brain is one of the most remembered scenes in horror history.
-  Special effects team used a realistic animatronic head of Ray Liotta (Krendler) for the brain removal scene.
-  The hanging and disembowelment of Inspector Pazzi mirrors the historic execution of Francesco Pazzi in 15th-century Florence.
-  Lecter's alias "Dr. Fell" is a reference to an old English nursery rhyme about a suspicious and disliked doctor.
-  The man-eating boars were inspired by real legends of feral swine being used for torture in ancient history.
-  Mason Verger's character is a wealthy, politically protected child molester, making him arguably more horrifying than Lecter.
-  The boar scenes were a combination of real pigs and animatronics, trained for months before shooting.
-  Lecter's handwritten letter to Clarice was actually written by Anthony Hopkins himself in character.
-  The scenes involving forensic science and brain surgery were advised by medical professionals to ensure realism.
-  Lecter's final line in the movie, "Try new things," is a darkly humorous play on the idea of expanding one's palate.
-  The cocktail dress Clarice wears when she wakes up was custom-designed to reflect a blend of vulnerability and formality.
-  The disturbing elements in both the book and film led some countries to heavily censor or ban the movie.
-  Lecter's cleaver in the final scene symbolizes both surgical precision and brutal violence.
-  Despite mixed reviews, Hannibal was a box office success, grossing over \$350 million worldwide.
