# Did You Know?



-  Red Dragon is a prequel to The Silence of the Lambs and the third film featuring Hannibal Lecter.
-  Edward Norton plays FBI profiler Will Graham, who seeks Lecter's help to catch the "Tooth Fairy."
-  Ralph Fiennes stars as the terrifying "Tooth Fairy" killer, Francis Dolarhyde.
-  The film explores the psychological battle between hunter and hunted.
-  The title refers to the William Blake painting The Great Red Dragon and the Woman Clothed with the Sun, central to the killer's obsession.
-  Brett Ratner, director of Rush Hour, directed Red Dragon.
-  The movie is praised for its tense atmosphere and psychological depth.
-  It's the first film to show Lecter before the events of The Silence of the Lambs.
-  Red Dragon grossed over \$209 million worldwide.
-  Edward Norton researched FBI profiling techniques to prepare for his role as Will Graham.
-  The nickname "Tooth Fairy" comes from Dolarhyde's brutal bite marks on his victims.
-  The film includes several references to The Silence of the Lambs, tying the stories together.
-  The Blake painting featured in the film is a real artwork housed at the Brooklyn Museum.
-  Reba McClane's blindness is symbolic of Dolarhyde's struggle to connect with the world.
-  Freddy Lounds was inspired by real-life tabloid journalists.
-  Close-up shots of eyes are used throughout the film to emphasize psychological insight.
-  Ralph Fiennes' performance as Dolarhyde was critically acclaimed despite mixed reviews of the film.
-  The film explores the psychological toll of violence on both victims and perpetrators.
