

- The Silence of the Lambs is one of only three films in history to win the "Big Five" Academy Awards: Best Picture, Best Director, Best Actor, Best Actress, and Best Adapted Screenplay.
- Anthony Hopkins is on screen for just under 17 minutes, yet he won the Oscar for Best Actor—one of the shortest performances to ever earn that award.
- The character of Hannibal Lecter is based partly on real-life doctor Alfredo Ballí Treviño, whom author Thomas Harris interviewed while working as a journalist in Mexico.
- In the standard standard speaking to be some said that she was genuinely afraid of Anthony Hopkins during filming and avoided speaking to him off-camera.
- The death's-head moth featured in the film was actually a combination of multiple insect species—and some were even dyed to achieve the eerie effect.
- The line "I ate his liver with some fava beans and a nice Chianti" was mostly improvised by Anthony Hopkins—and he added the unsettling slurping noise spontaneously.
- Real moths were used in some scenes, while others used puppet moths controlled with threads or air tubes for close-up shots.
- The iconic scene where Lecter and Clarice first meet is shot with tight close-ups and direct eye contact, creating discomfort and intensity.
- Scott Glenn, who played Jack Crawford, spent time with real FBI agents—including famed profiler John Douglas—to prepare for the role.
- Later the line "It puts the lotion on its skin" by Buffalo Bill became one of the most quoted and parodied lines in film history.
- Buffalo Bill's infamous dance scene to "Goodbye Horses" by Q Lazzarus was largely improvised and became a cultural touchstone.
- The film was released on Valentine's Day 1991, an ironic contrast to its dark and disturbing subject matter.
- The title The Silence of the Lambs refers to Clarice's childhood trauma, where she heard lambs screaming as they were being slaughtered—a metaphor for innocence lost.
- Gene Hackman originally purchased the rights to the novel and intended to direct and star as Jack Crawford, but dropped out due to concerns over the story's violence.
- Actor Ted Levine (Buffalo Bill) avoided publicity for a time after the film's release because fans confused his role with his real personality.
- The film's poster—with a skull-like death's-head moth over Jodie Foster's face—was inspired by a Salvador Dalí artwork composed of naked women.
- Director Jonathan Demme insisted that Hannibal Lecter never blink on camera, contributing to his unsettling presence.
- Hopkins memorized the entire script—including other characters' lines—so he could maintain control and pacing during scenes.
