- 鼡 Created by Paul Abbott, ran from 2004 to 2013 and followed the chaotic lives of the Gallagher family and their neighbours. It was praised for its raw portrayal of working-class life.
- 🊀 Played by Bonnie Langford, Mel originally appeared alongside the Sixth and Seventh Doctors in the 1980s and returned to the TARDIS in the new era under showrunner Russell T Davies.
- A classic British sitcom about a father-and-son rag-and-bone business. The show, which ran from 1962 to 1974, was a major influence on later sitcoms. A
- 😔 The show began in 1973 with these three characters. Michael Bates (Blamire) was later replaced by Brian Wilde as Foggy when Bates left the show due to ill health.
- A cult-favourite UK game show that aired in the 1990s and was later revived. Contestants navigated themed zones to win crystals for time in the final "Crystal Dome."
- 🍝 The hoax report claimed Swiss farmers were harvesting spaghetti from trees. It was so convincing that viewers contacted the BBC asking how to grow their own spaghetti trees!
- preated by Carla Lane, was one of the most-watched UK television series during the late 1980s.
- 🥞 Also known for her role in Not Going Out and has authored several books. 8.
- 😭 The cat symbolised Rigsby's grumpy yet oddly sentimental character—he often showed more affection to the cat than to the tenants.
- 10. In Often sparked political controversy and public debate, and its fearless style helped inspire later investigative journalism formats.
- 11. 🚀 Inspired novels, a stage show, and even a U.S. remake attempt. It's a cult favourite among sci-fi fans.
