- **& Cinematography Snub** Critics loved the film's visual style, but it didn't get an Oscar nod for cinematography—surprising for such a visually immersive film.
- **Box Office Hit** Made on a modest \$3.3 million budget, it grossed over \$100 million worldwide—talk about a financial victory!
- Improvisation Magic Director Forman encouraged actors to improvise, giving the hospital a chaotic, unpredictable, almost "real-life" feel.
- **Timeless Legacy** In 1993, the American Film Institute ranked it the 33rd greatest American film of all time. Its rebellious spirit is still celebrated today.
