1. 🍷 Tangerine appeared on Led Zeppelin III and was partly inspired by one of Jimmy Page's former girlfriends.
2. 🚤 Sailing became one of Rod Stewart's signature songs despite him admitting he never actually liked sailing.
3. 🔥 Iggy Pop recorded Lust for Life after a period of heavy drug addiction and personal struggles.
4. 🎤 Lulu's version of The Man Who Sold the World was produced by Bowie himself.
5. 🍷 Ringo Starr reportedly wrote Back Off Boogaloo after a dinner conversation with Marc Bolan.
6. 🎤 Billy Idol's sneering punk image later helped him become a huge MTV star in the 1980s.
7. 🎤 Donna Summer's Love to Love You Baby caused controversy due to its highly suggestive vocals.
8. 🎤 Tina Turner's powerful vocals turned Proud Mary into one of her signature songs.
9. 🎤 Lynyrd Skynyrd's band name came from teacher Leonard Skinner, who hated long hair on boys.
10. 🎷 The saxophone solo on Baker Street was played by Raphael Ravenscroft, who was reportedly paid just £27 for the session.
11. 🌙 Nights in White Satin was first released in 1967 but became a major hit in the early 1970s after a re-release.
12. 🎹 Emerson, Lake & Palmer were known for extravagant live shows featuring spinning pianos and massive stage productions.
