- Quincy Jones almost didn't produce Thriller because he initially thought some of the songs weren't strong enough. Safe to say it worked out alright.
- Marillion fans helped fund the album before crowdfunding websites even existed — basically Kickstarter before Kickstarter.
- Dido became globally famous after Eminem sampled "Thank You" in the hit song "Stan."
- "Waltzinblack" sounds classy and mysterious — which perfectly suited Keith Floyd wandering around Europe with a glass of wine.
- Sade took their name from singer Helen Folasade Adu, though most people simply know her as Sade.
- Music for the Jilted Generation became an anthem for 1990s rave culture and annoyed plenty of politicians along the way.
- The Rolling Stones recorded parts of Exile on Main St. in a French villa while avoiding UK taxes.
- Radiohead confused fans with Kid A by ditching much of their guitar sound for electronic experimentation.
- The Beatles (White Album) is officially self-titled, but almost nobody calls it The Beatles.
- Beck once described his musical style as "confused" — which somehow suits him perfectly.
- The Harder They Come played a massive role in introducing reggae music to audiences outside Jamaica.
- Nevermind famously featured a baby swimmi
