5. 🗨️ Sam Allardyce made his name at Bolton by turning them into one of the Premier League's most awkward teams to play against.
6. 📄 David Pleat also had several spells connected to Spurs, proving football management can be less "career path" and more "revolving door".
7. 🎵 "You'll Never Walk Alone" began life as a show tune before becoming one of football's most famous terrace anthems.
8. ⌚ The 3pm Saturday kick-off is so traditional in English football that it practically smells of pies, Bovril, and questionable refereeing decisions.
9. 🧢 Edwin van der Sar went on to win multiple Premier League titles with Manchester United — Fulham fans may prefer not to dwell on that.
10. 🧙 Stanley Matthews was known as "The Wizard of the Dribble", which sounds more like a pub nickname than a knighthood-worthy football title.
11. 🍷 George Best's life off the pitch was almost as headline-grabbing as his footwork on it — and that is saying something.
12. 🍷 Johan Cruyff helped shape Barcelona's football identity, so every stylish passing move since probably owes him a quiet nod.
