1. 🎯 Bullseye contestants often won speedboats, caravans and fitted kitchens — whether they had anywhere to put them or not!
2. 🗨️ Blankety Blank became famous as much for its cheeky celebrity banter as for the actual quiz answers.
3. 🕵️ Deal or No Deal never revealed the identity of "The Banker", making them one of British TV's great unseen mysteries.
4. 😄 Richard Herring famously joked that winning Taskmaster was the greatest achievement of his career.
5. 📺 "Don't just watch the adverts... win them!" became one of the most recognisable catchphrases from Saturday Night Takeaway.
6. 🎤 The Chase's Chasers often use their intimidating nicknames more than their real names in public appearances.
7. 🌐 Going for Gold was filmed entirely in English, even though contestants came from across Europe.
8. 📖 The first ever £1 million winner on Who Wants to Be a Millionaire? was Judith Keppel in 2000.
9. 🏃 The Traitors became such a hit that phrases like "faithful" and "traitor" quickly entered everyday conversation in the UK.
10. 🏆 A Question of Sport ran for more than 50 years, making it one of the longest-running sports quiz shows in television history.
