1. 🍷 Charles Rennie Mackintosh helped shape Glasgow's distinctive style — proving Scotland can do more than castles and deep-fried snacks.
2. 🐎 The Kelpies stand around 30 metres tall, making them slightly harder to stable than normal horses.
3. 🌍 The Highland Boundary Fault stretches from Arran to Stonehaven and marks one of Scotland's most important geological divides.
4. 🏴󠁧󠁢󠁦󠁿 Fife is sometimes nicknamed the "Kingdom of Fife," which sounds far grander than most places with a Greggs.
5. ⚡ Torness Nuclear Power Station has been generating electricity since the late 1980s.
6. 🐉 Loch Morar is deeper than Loch Ness — but its monster has terrible PR.
7. 🏠 Edradour Distillery produces whisky on a tiny scale compared to Scotland's industrial giants.
8. 🍷 Tam o' Shanter caps became famous worldwide despite being named after a man staggering home drunk.
9. 🚢 The RSS Discovery carried Captain Scott on his first Antarctic expedition in 1901.
10. 🌊 Loch Ness contains more freshwater than every lake in England and Wales put together — handy if Nessie gets thirsty.
11. 🏰 Dunvegan Castle has belonged to Clan MacLeod for over 750 years, which must make family arguments awkward.
12. 🎭 Brigadoon became world famous thanks to the musical and film about the mysterious disappearing village.
