ONE FOR THE BAR!

- James Dean died in a car crash just weeks before Rebel Without a Cause was released.
- Despite the title, there are actually more than seven key heroes featured throughout the film.
- Michael Caine famously admitted he never actually drove the Mini Coopers during the movie's most famous scenes.
- Annie Hall beat Star Wars to the Academy Award for Best Picture.
- Burt Reynolds later said Smokey and the Bandit was the most enjoyable film he ever made.
- Despite being 33 years older than Sophia Loren, Clark Gable still played her romantic lead in It Started in Naples, which was filmed on location around Naples, Capri and Rome.
- Gene Wilder co-wrote the screenplay and insisted the film be shot in black and white to resemble classic horror movies.
- Albert Finney received an Oscar nomination for his portrayal of the famous Belgian detective.
- Kirk Douglas helped break Hollywood's blacklist by publicly crediting screenwriter Dalton Trumbo.
- Author John le Carré drew on his own experiences in British intelligence, helping make the novel one of the most realistic spy stories ever written.
- The story was based on the real-life Gilbreth family, who genuinely had twelve children.
- Johnny Weissmuller won five Olympic gold medals before becoming cinema's most famous Tarzan.
