1. 🍷 Inga Tuigamala brought unprecedented power and explosiveness to the wing, influencing a whole generation of players in both union and league.
2. 🏆 Bill Beaumont later became one of rugby’s most respected administrators, serving as Chairman of World Rugby.
3. 🌸 Western Samoa’s 1991 upset over Wales remains one of the Rugby World Cup’s most iconic giant-killing moments.
4. 🏆 England were a dominant force in early-2000s sevens rugby, regularly reaching the final stages of top tournaments.
5. 🏥 JPR Williams balanced elite rugby with his medical career, making him one of the sport’s most fascinating dual professionals.
6. ❤️ Sean Fitzpatrick captained the All Blacks 51 times, becoming a symbol of New Zealand’s rugby dominance in the 1990s.
7. 🌿 The silver fern is an instantly recognisable emblem of New Zealand and has been associated with sports teams for more than a century.
8. 🇮🇹 IT Italy joined the tournament in 2000, officially turning the Five Nations into the Six Nations.
9. 🗣️ Will Carling’s “old farts” remark caused widespread controversy but didn’t stop him being remembered as one of England’s greatest captains.
10. ❤️ The New South Wales Blues and Queensland Maroons have one of the fiercest rivalries in world sport through the State of Origin series.
11. 🏆 The final was decided by Jonny Wilkinson’s famous drop goal in extra time, one of the most iconic moments in rugby history.
12. 🇦🇺 AU Australia is one of the few nations to win multiple Rugby World Cups, earning the nickname “Wallabies dynasty” for their 1990s dominance.
